### Shelter for Homeless Families

As of July 1, 2009, the Department of Housing and Community Development (DHCD) is responsible for administering emergency shelter to Massachusetts's families. The Division of Housing Stabilization was created to deal specifically with this issue. Families seeking shelter should go to one of the following locations and ask for the **DHCD worker**:

The DHCD worker will assess the family's situation: (1) are they homeless, (2) are there any other options besides shelter and (3) is the family eligible for Emergency Assistance (EA), which is having a household income at or below 115% of the federal poverty guideline.

If client is not eligible for Emergency Assistance (EA), there are VERY FEW shelter beds in the Commonwealth for these families.
